Covid-19 Protocols

Wycombe Wanderers do not have any specific Covid-19 requirements for this game.

However, Ipswich Town Football Club asks supporters to be respectful of their fellow supporters and not to attend the game if you are suffering from Covid-19 symptoms, are feeling unwell, have been asked to isolate or if you have been in close contact with anyone experiencing symptoms or who has tested positive. In the event that Covid-19 symptoms develop whilst at Fratton Park, please notify the nearest member of staff immediately.

If you not fully vaccinated, it is recommended that you return a negative lateral flow test prior to attending the game.

We have picked out the key information for Town fans below and added other material based on our own experience of visiting Adams Park, particularly information that is specific to our fans.

Specific information for Town fans:

Ticket news

Tickets for this game are sold out.

Note, that all tickets for the original date are valid for this new date. If you are unable to attend please return your ticket for a refund.

There are 6 wheelchair user spaces for away supporters. Fans with disabilities should contact ITFC's Disability Officer Lee Smith on lee.smith@itfc.co.uk or 01473 400556.

Travel to Wycombe Wanderers

Supporters Coach

Coaches will leave from behind the Sir Bobby Robson stand at 15:00. Please ensure you are at Portman Road at least 15 minutes before this.

Coach travel is on general sale, though only a few seats remain. The cost is £18 for adults, £15 for seniors and £12 for U19s. Please note that each ticket will incur a £1.50 booking fee.

Note that all official coaches are non-smoking and the consumption of alcohol and hot food on board is strictly forbidden. Supporters under 16 must be accompanied by a parent/guardian.

If you are travelling on the coach and are not fully vaccinated at the point of travel it is recommended that you return a negative lateral flow test prior to travel.

Car

The Sat Nav postcode for Adams Park is HP12 4HJ.

From Ipswich, take the A12 to the M25. Join the M25 signposted M11 / M1 / Stansted Airport / Watford. Continue on the M25 to junction 16 (M40). Use the left two lanes to merge onto the M40 towards Birmingham / Oxford.

Leave the M40 at junction 4 and follow the signs to Aylesbury on the A4010 (John Hall Way). Adams Park should be signposted from the M40 with brown football / stadium signs. Cross over three small roundabouts into New Road continuing down the hill to two mini roundabouts at the bottom. Turn sharp left at the first into Lane End Road and continue to the next mini roundabout at which turn right into Hillbottom Road. Adams Park is situated at the very end of the road.

Note that traffic is often heavy around Adams Park on matchdays so drivers are advised to allow plenty of time and are encouraged to arrive early.

Google maps indicates a typical journey time of around 2 hours 30 minutes. We would suggest that you allow at least another hour beyond the AA / Google / SatNav suggested journey time, to allow for possible delays and for it being an evening game.

Parking

There are limited parking facilities at the ground and access before and after the game is often busy as there is only one road leading to and from the stadium. The lower tier car park is fully booked but spaces in the upper tier can be pre-booked via <https://tickets.wwfc.com/Stadium?eventId=444> for £10. No parking at the ground is available to buy on the day of the game.

Street parking is also available in the vicinity of the ground. However, traffic wardens patrol the area regularly so you are asked to park sensibly and respect people living in the Sands area.

There is also a new Park and Ride scheme from West Wycombe, which runs regular shuttles from Cowleaze Field (post code HP14 3BA) before and after the game. The cost is £5 per car, cash only. 30 seater buses will depart Cowleaze Field every 15 minutes from 17:30 until 19:30. Return shuttles will be available after the game. Note that due to heavy traffic along the road to the stadium on a matchday the buses may drop-off and pick up at the end of Hillbottom Road rather than outside the Adams Park gates.

Disabled Supporters Parking

We understand that there are some spaces for Blue badge holders in the lower tier car park. These have to be pre-booked via the Wycombe ticket office on tickets@wwfc.com.

Train

Note: It is not possible to get back to Ipswich after the game. It is however, possible to get back as far as Colchester (see below).

High Wycombe, the nearest station to the stadium, is served by the Chiltern Railways line out of London Marylebone. The station is approximately 2.5 miles from the stadium.

The journey time from Ipswich to High Wycombe is between 2 hours 40 minutes and 3 hours.

From Liverpool Street take the underground to London Marylebone. The obvious route is the Circle / Hammersmith & City / Metropolitan line to Baker Street and change on to the Bakerloo line to Marylebone. Alternatively, Marylebone is only around a 10-minute walk from Baker Street. Trains from Marylebone to High Wycombe run at regular intervals and take between 23 and 38 minutes. Note there are slower trains as well – for example, trains leaving Marylebone at 53 minutes past the hour take up to an hour – these are the trains that go via Wembley Central.

After the game it is not possible to get back to Ipswich. However, for those travelling back as far as Colchester only there are options available. www.greateranglia.co.uk shows the 22:45 and 23:00 trains from High Wycombe connecting with the 00:18 and 00:46 from Liverpool Street to Colchester respectively. Note that there is also a train from High Wycombe at 22:18 (which connects to the 23:48 from Liverpool Street to Colchester). It may be possible to make this train if you take the shuttle bus at 22:00 (see below) or a taxi from the end of Hillbottom Road but this will be very dependent on traffic and the availability of space on the bus.

For those travelling back to London only there are trains at 22:18 (see note above), 22:26 (slower train), 22:45, 23:00, 23:18, 23:23 (slower train) and 23:42.

For those staying in Wycombe there are many options available on Wednesday to get you home.

Whatever your travel plans, it's worth checking www.greateranglia.co.uk for updated times and any late changes.

Getting to the ground from the station

High Wycombe station is approximately 2.5 miles from the stadium. To get the stadium you can take a bus or travel via taxi.

The number 32 bus from the bus station goes to the Hourglass pub which is a 15-minute walk to the stadium.

This season Wycombe Wanderers have teamed up with Arriva and Chiltern Railways for a new bus service from High Wycombe rail station on home matchdays. The service will depart from the rail station (bay 18) at 18:15 and 19:00. The return journey will leave at 22:00. This is a direct bus from the rail station to the end of Hillbottom Road (on which the stadium is situated). Fares are £3 per person return with no singles offered.

Pubs

We have done our best to ensure that the listed pubs will be open and operating without major Covid restrictions. Please understand that some might limit numbers or insist on small groups and table service.

The Flint Cottage (previously known as Bootleggers) opposite the station has one real ale plus some craft keg options, and there is a Wetherspoons – the Falcon – amongst other pubs in the town centre. The Hourglass is the nearest pub to the ground (about a 15-minute walk) – we understand that they usually admit both home and away fans.

At the ground

Hospitality

Cashless stadium

Adams Park is an entirely cashless stadium, so please take a cashless payment mechanism (credit/debit card, smartphone app or pre-paid card all accepted).

WiFi

Wifi is available in the stadium.

Away Fan Village

Away fans are invited to visit the Away Fan Village by the entrance to the stadium. This sells soft and alcoholic drinks, with catering provided by Funky Elephant serving a variety of Caribbean cuisine.

Away end

Away fans are accommodated in the East Stand behind one goal. This stand is under cover, with no restricted views.

Please note that there will be a large away following and our fans will include older fans, families, those unable to stand for long periods of time and ambulant disabled fans. Please bear this in mind and please respect those who want to sit at this game as we want everyone to enjoy the day safely.

Security

As at most stadiums stewards may ask to search your bag.

Programmes

Copies of the matchday programme BluePrint can be picked up for £3 (cashless) from Sandie's Hut close to the front gate.

Food and Drink facilities

Inside the stadium, each stand is serviced by a kiosk serving hot and cold food and drink, including burgers, hot dogs, pies and chips, plus tea, coffee and fizzy drinks, chocolate and sweets.

Smoking

Smoking is not allowed in the stadium. This includes e-cigarettes.

Zero tolerance policy on pyrotechnics

Wycombe Wanderers has a zero-tolerance policy in relation to the use of pyrotechnics inside the stadium on matchdays. Any supporter found to be carrying or letting off a pyrotechnic inside Adams Park will receive an immediate long-term ban from the stadium. This applies to flares, smoke bombs and fireworks.

This policy is in line with guidelines issued by FIFA, UEFA, the FA and EFL which also state that details of anyone committing such an offence will be forwarded to the police and could lead to criminal proceedings.

Anti Social Behaviour – Matchday Text Line

Racism or discrimination of any form is not OK, 'Not Today or Any Day' and supporters are reminded that instances of discriminatory or prejudiced behaviour will not be tolerated at any EFL game.



The use of threatening behaviour, foul or abusive language as well as racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment is not tolerated at Adams Park and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the ground.

If you witness any inappropriate behaviour please speak to a steward.
